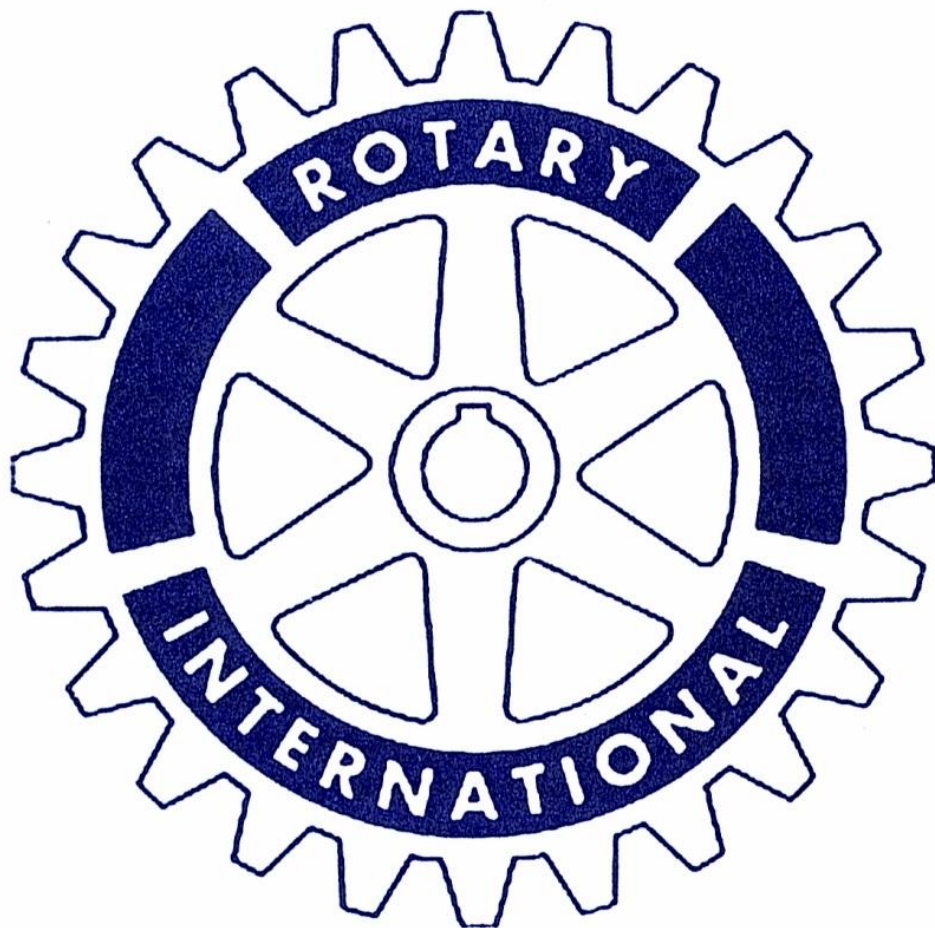

NEWARK ROTARY CLUB

History of the Newark Rotary Club

The year was 1926, the 21st year of the Rotary movement and the year that the Newark Rotary Club began. The Club started on October 28, 1926, with 26 charter members. Today our club membership is about 95, of which many are female Rotarians. Rotary International adopted a policy in 1987, whereby women could be considered for membership. Mary Morrison (who played piano at our weekly meeting for many, many years) was named an Honorary Member. Hannelora Reinhardt became our first female Rotarian and later became our first woman Rotarian president.

Over the years, Newark Rotarians have given substantial support to Rotary's now Five Avenues of Service: Club, Vocation, International, Community, and New Generations. Newark Rotary sponsored new clubs in Williamson and Wolcott in 1928 and Palmyra in 1950. Each week a club bulletin is published which reflects the personality of our organization. Club meetings are held each Thursday at noon at the Quality Inn -Newark.

Newark Rotary was the organizational force and sole sponsor of the Rotary Boys Band in 1927, which expanded to the Newark High School Band in 1937. Over the years, we have been heavily involved with many community projects sponsoring and/or supporting Camp Onseyawa, scholarships, Victims Resource Center, Meals on Wheels, American Red Cross, DARE, Canal Park Beautification, Community Center, Perkins Park, Newarkfest, Hill Cumorah concessions, Pancake Day, annual Blood Analysis with Newark Wayne Hospital, Girl and Boy Scouts, needy families, Halloween Party, T. Spencer Knight Memorial Park, an AED unit in the Quality Inn, Literacy Volunteers, High School Interact Club, and many more.

Internationally, Newark Rotary has been involved with the Bethany Home and School in the Philippines since 1967, arranged for the shipment of surplus civil defense food to Bangladesh, and supports the Rotary International Youth Exchange Program and Group Study Exchange Program. We have made contributions to The Rotary Foundation of over \$210,000 and have 34 Paul Harris Fellows. The Newark Club was the first club in our district (thanks to Bob Goodman) to make a contribution to Rotary International's POLIO PLUS campaign (eradication of polio worldwide) which began in 1985. The POLIO PLUS program is Rotary's gift to the children of the 21st century. The club has purchased an ambulance in India, provided a van to deliver food in Argentina, supported a special education school in the Philippines, given to Honduran relief, adopted an orphanage in Haiti, supports Water for Sudan, and provides Shelter Boxes.

In celebrating our 85th anniversary, we also celebrate Norma Madayag-Reilly, as our District Governor for 2011-2012. Norma is the first District Governor from our club. This is a difficult and time consuming love of Rotary job that means she, along with her husband Gary, will travel to all the district clubs to make her visits. Because Norma is from our club, we get to host the district conference in Rochester in May, 2012. This is a big commitment and has been a 3-4year planning project and needs the help of all our members and their families. We are proud of Norma and Gary and their hard work.
